One of the skills we have focused on this month is '**Predicting**'. This is when the reader needs to use the information that is given, or implied by the text, combined with their own life experiences, to make a sensible guess about what has happened, or what will happen. Have a go with the picture below.

- What kind of monster is this?
- Where did it come from? Has it been here before?
- What do you think the kitten is dreaming of?
- What is the monster going to do?
- What do you think will happen next?

Continue this story – include an unexpected twist.
