			Pupils have been and will continue to be taught about how to interact with the school dog (further guidance on this can be seen in our 'Dog Policy').	
			Pupils will be taught what to do to prevent the dog from chasing them, jumping up at them, scratching them or even biting them (further guidance on this can be seen in our 'Dog Policy').	
			All staff will have been introduced to the dog and expectations of having a school dog.	
			The dog will attend the vets regularly to ensure she is in good health and that her claws are kept short.

Children will be taught to wash their hands after active participation with the dog Should the dog defecate on the school site a member of staff will clear this up immediately and dispose of it in a safe way. They will be trained to toilet in an area of the grounds that children have limited access to. The area will be disinfected as required. All immunisations are kept up to date in accordance with the European Pet Passport Scheme and a record will be kept of this. Flea treatment is carried out at monthly/or quarterly interval, depending on the age of the dogs. The dog will not be allowed in the school dining hall at mealtimes; and never in the food preparation area.	
Financial cost of the dogs' upkeep.
